textile fabric print inspired by the hawai'i shirt

with Nanna



Hawai'i shirts, which first appeared around 1840, are still a popular piece of clothing today. After a guided tour through the "Hawai'i - Royal Islands in the Pacific" special exhibition, the workshop first explains the history and motifs of the Hawai'i shirt, examines variations and design elements and discusses the "characteristics" of a real shirt: a straight hem at the bottom, coconut shell buttons and a stitched breast pocket that does not break the pattern.

A technical introduction to textile printing will be followed by exercises in the practical part. Finally, inspired by the Hawai'i shirt, fabric 35 x 35 cm pieces will be printed with stamps, stencils and paint. Individually designed floral designs. Three pieces of fabric are prepared for each participant. Copies of all exercises will be handed out.
